- 2. If you want to visit with someone, please leave the War Room and go to the back hallway.

Please do not talk amongst yourselves during the teaching and worship time. Some cannot hear over the talking and it is distracting.

- 4. The knowledge you receive here is powerful to touch and change lives. Please be considerate of others and please, don't be a distraction.
- 5. After you finish ministry, when waiting in the waiting area, please keep your voice and laughter low in consideration of others who have not finished.
- 6. Please report *anything* regarding the person you are ministering to Richard Peterson, Chris Davis or Everett Cox immediately after you have completed ministry in these specific areas:

Any immediate threat of violence to themselves (suicide, cutting) or others, abuse or endangerment to children or the elderly. This is a legal requirement under the statutes of the State of Oklahoma as well as most other states. (You are NOT required to let the person know that you are sharing this information with Deliverance Ministries, Inc.)

Sitting in During Ministry Guidelines

- 1. Please, do not plan to sit in with the person you brought for ministry. They may be inhibited and unable to be completely open and let God deal with the root issues in their life. You and they may not be aware of inhibition.
- 2. Minister is to let the one being ministered to understand that there are interns sitting in, in the same way interns are taught at a teaching hospital.

 (Minister may opt out beforehand. Be gracious.)
- 3. Observe the team leader as they minister and **pray** for them under your breath.
- 4. **Pray in the Spirit** for the team leader and the individual receiving ministry. (Quietly, under your breath.) **Quietly release the power of God, the anointing of the Holy Spirit** as the team leader ministers to the recipient.
- 5. Learn everything you can by **observing** the ministry. (Minister may ask you to)
- 6. **Focus on what the Holy Spirit is doing.** Keep your eyes open and develop your awareness of the how the Holy Spirit moving during ministry.
- 7. Take notes on what the Holy Spirit is teaching you during this time.
- 8. **DO NOT interrupt minister at any time.** Do not ask questions or ask permission to speak. Especially, do not correct the minister or distract the minister in any way. If you have an impression that you believe the Holy Spirit is giving you, which applies specifically to the person receiving ministry, ask the Holy Spirit for an opportunity to share it in writing. Carefully write down what it is that you are hearing or impressed with, and give it to the team leader at that appropriate time.
 - (This is not a time for you to be sharing your experiences or your testimony of what God did for you. This is a time for the Holy Spirit to meet the person receiving ministry and bring comfort into their lives.)
- 9. **DO NOT,** under any circumstance, recommend anything to anyone at any time anything that requires a prescription, changes a doctor's diagnosis or is considered questionable by anyone in leadership with Deliverance Ministries, Inc. We are not licensed medical doctors.
