War Room

- 1. Please turn off your cell phones.**
- 2. If you want to visit with someone, please leave the War Room and go to the back hallway.**
- 3. We do offer time from 5:30-5:45 pm for questions, comments, testimonies, and fellowship.**
 - 5:45-6:20 pm – Basic Training**
(Approximate times)
 - 6:20-7:00 pm – Advanced Training**
 - 7:00-7.15 pm – Communion, Commission, Shofar, Personal Ministry**

Please do not talk amongst yourselves during the teaching and worship time. Some cannot hear over the talking and it is distracting.
- 4. The knowledge you receive here is powerful to touch and change lives. Please be considerate of others and please, don't be a distraction.**
- 5. After you finish ministry, when waiting in the waiting area, please keep your voice and laughter low in consideration of others who have not finished.**

Please report *anything* regarding the person you are ministering to Richard Peterson, Chris Davis or Everett Cox immediately after you have completed ministry in these specific areas:

Any immediate threat of violence to themselves (suicide, cutting) or others, abuse or endangerment to children or the elderly. This is a legal requirement under the statutes of the State of Oklahoma as well as most other states. (You are NOT required to let the person know that you are sharing this information with Deliverance Ministries, Inc.)

Ministry Procedures

- 6. After Advanced Training, communion is completed, and the shofar is sounded, please go directly to the area where the people are waiting for an assignment to a minister.**
- 7. Trained ministers: proceed to the front of the room so that ministry can be assigned.**
- 8. Ministers in training: determine ahead of time who you are going to sit in with, wait in the hallway without impeding foot traffic, watch for the person you will sit in with and go with them for ministry. To make sure there is no interruption in ministry, please plan to stay until the ministry is finished.**
- 9. If you have already been assigned to minister to someone and know who they are, please contact them and take them to an area for ministry.**
- 10. Ministry to children under the age of 15 is scheduled ahead of time after their parents have received ministry.**
- 11. Wait for the person in leadership to appoint you to an individual to receive ministry. Please, as much as possible, refrain from ministering to a person you know. They may not be totally honest.**
- 12. When sitting in with a minister, please do not say anything during ministry. This is a time to learn. If Holy Spirit prompts you with an insight, a word of knowledge, a sense; please write it down, and pass the information to the minister in such a way as to refrain from disrupting the flow of ministry.**
- 13. Please use the 13 rooms on the W. side of the building for ministry. Also, please use the two large rooms, and the landing, E. of the elevator area for ministry. There are several locations that can be used. (Please leave the training chairs in**

place.)

14. **When ministering in the training room, please use the smaller tables and the open area to minister. This makes it possible for us to put chairs back to their respective places at the 4 tables on the N. side of the room.**
15. **We are providing small trash cans with plastic liners for those that need them. In the event that you use a trash can in the room that you are ministering in, please empty the trash can.**
16. **After ministry, please replace the chairs, or any other items moved during ministry, to the place they were when you came in.**
17. **Group Ministry Only: Please reserve the introduction/door closing room for group ministry, and not individual ministry. Also, please restrict fellowship to the area where the couches and chairs are. We need to be able to put the chairs back, in the introduction room, in their stacks at the back of the room and set up a circle of 12 chairs in the middle.**
18. **DO NOT, under any circumstance, recommend anything to anyone at any time anything that requires a prescription, changes a doctor's diagnosis or is considered questionable by anyone in leadership with Deliverance Ministries, Inc. We are not licensed medical doctors.**
19. **Waiting Room: Please reserve the room with the couch and lounge chairs, along with tables and chairs near the glass windows for those who are waiting on others who are being ministered to and fellowship with other ministers.**
20. **During ministry, please pay attention to the starred sections to complete ministry in an order we have found for years to be most beneficial.**

Interview – 20 minutes, Breaking of Ungodly Soul Ties, Inner Healing, Deliverance, Possible integrating of parts of their soul, Blessing, Baptism of the Holy Spirit, questions re: willingness to change lifestyle to God’s way of life and a willingness to be a part of a small group or church.

- 21. We have 4 notebooks of information gleaned from Henry Wright and BeInHealth.com. The information is not complete because there are over 1,000 diseases with possible spiritual roots of diseases. We have only printed 400+. Use the information by taking a picture on your phone without removing the pages from the books. In the event that the disease you are searching for is not in the books, see Richard Peterson, who can research online to provide the information that may be helpful in ministry.**
- 22. When you have completed ministry, please escort the person you ministered to out to the front of the building because this is a secured building. (Possible exceptions: the person you ministered to is waiting on a friend or family member that is receiving ministry; then, they are to remain peacefully in the waiting room. Those who have completed ministry are not allowed to roam the hallways looking for the person they came with. This will create unrest for them and the person they are waiting on.)**
- 23. Then, you will be able to complete filling out forms for the ministry you have accomplished.**
- 24. Thank you for investing your time, energy, expertise, love, and ministry to people reaching out.**

Sitting in During Ministry Guidelines

- 1. Please, do not plan to sit in with the person you brought for ministry. They may be inhibited and unable to be completely open, and let God deal with the root issues in their life. You and they may not be aware of inhibition; however, in our experience we have observed it happening frequently.**
- 2. Minister is to let the one being ministered to understand that there are interns sitting in, in the same way interns are taught at a teaching hospital. (Minister may opt out beforehand. Be gracious.)**
- 3. Observe the team leader as they minister and pray for them under your breath.**
- 4. Pray in the Spirit for the team leader and the individual receiving ministry. (Quietly, under your breath.) Quietly release the power of God, the anointing of the Holy Spirit as the team leader ministers to the recipient.**
- 5. DO NOT interrupt minister at any time. Do not ask questions or ask permission to speak. Especially, do not correct the minister or distract the minister in any way. If you have an impression that you believe the Holy Spirit is giving you, which applies specifically to the person receiving ministry, ask the Holy Spirit for an opportunity to share it in writing. Carefully write down what it is that you are hearing or impressed with, and give it to the team leader at that appropriate time. (This is not a time for you to be sharing your experiences or your testimony of what God did for you. This is a time for the Holy Spirit to meet the person receiving ministry and bring comfort into their lives.)**
- 6. DO NOT, under any circumstance, recommend anything to anyone at any time anything that requires a prescription, changes a doctor's diagnosis or is considered questionable by anyone in leadership with Deliverance Ministries,**

- 7. Learn everything you can by observing the ministry. (Minister may ask you to Please follow their directions.)**
- 8. Focus on what the Holy Spirit is doing. Keep your eyes open and develop your awareness of the how the Holy Spirit is moving during ministry.**
- 9. Take notes on what the Holy Spirit is teaching you during this time.**
- 10. Deliverance Ministries is not only a ministry, but also a place of fellowship. Don't let anything written above hinder fellowship. Our goal is to complete successful ministry that people coming for ministry are expecting, in an orderly fashion.**
